Time

- Being on time to school and to lessons

Uniform

Option One

Suit

A smart business suit – navy, black, charcoal grey or another dark colour

or

Blazer

A blazer/ tailored jacket with trousers may also be worn

Shirt

Smart plain business shirt in pale colours

Tie

A smart business-like tie must be worn with top button done up

Jumper

A plain (no logo) jumper which co-ordinates with the jacket may also be worn. The tie should be visible. Hoodies should not be worn.

Shoes

Shoes must be formal, smart and dark in colour (no trainers)



Option Two

Suit

A smart business suit – navy, black, charcoal grey or any other dark colour

or

Blazer

A blazer / tailored jacket with trousers, skirt or dress may also be worn

Blouse

Smart plain business blouse in pale or dark colours

Skirt/Dress/Trousers

Smart skirt / dress or trousers (skirts should be worn on or just above the knee)

Jumper

A plain (no logo) jumper which coordinates with the jacket may also be worn. Hoodies should not be worn.

Shoes

Shoes must be formal, smart and dark in colour - no trainers and if a heel is desired, it must be low.
