The Careers Programme has been designed with both the Gatsby Benchmarks and the CDI Framework in mind. Students will have several careers related opportunities throughout the academic year to complement their studies and continue to develop their employability skills in preparation for the world of work. The University Technical College leads by example on having Employer Sponsors and Partners support the education of all our students. A high number of activities are embedded within the careers programme and continued to be delivered year on year, whilst there are also opportunities that are additional and are considered on an annual basis.
